2020 in a nutshell: COVID-19




- Virtual AGM

- Most hosted: FedEx (10)




Members (Attended) IIII Non-members (Attended)




Webinars

- New avenue through which to significantly improve ASEG and sponsor visibility





The membership




Note the decrease in membership in SA/NT, Qld and Vic. This has had the effect of increasing the relative proportions of NSW & ACT membership


