














The first meeting of the ASEG was held on 4 June 1970 with 45 prospective

members in attendance. Reflecting the emphasis on Australian, and on exploration, the meeting resolved unanimously that the newly incorporated body would have a distinctive name "The Australian Society of Exploration Geophysicists"

MINUTES OF THE FIRST MEETING OF THE AUSTRALIAN SOCIETY OF EXPLORATION GEOPHYSICISTS, HELD AT THE MINING CLUB, SYDNEY, ON 4TH JUNE, 1970.

The meeting was called to order by President (pro-tem) Robin MacQueen with 45 prospective members in attendance. The President briefly described the history of the formation of the local society.

The first item of business on the agenda was presentation of the society's proposed constitution. It was moved and seconded that the constitution be accepted, and after limited discussion concerning the proposed name for the society, the motion carried unanimously.
